# Wolsey Park Development update

Welcome to the second development update for Wolsey Park, a quarterly newsletter that we will use to provide updates and information on progress across the development, next steps and what to expect.

# **About Wolsey Park**

Located on the western fringe of the market town of Rayleigh, Wolsey Park is an exciting new community of tradition style 2-5 bedroom houses.

Countryside are currently building their second phase of the development comprising 76 new homes and associated open space. Phase 2 is Countryside's second phase of the wider development.

All homes on Phase 2 will be fitted with PV panels and benefit from an electric charging point as standard.

# Streetlighting

We are pleased to report that the faulty streetlights along Wolsey Park road have been repaired and all lights are now working.

# **Construction Advancing Well**

Works are progressing well on site with our second phase. The northern part of the phase is now complete with occupations taking place in December last year.

Construction works will continue throughout 2024 and progress down the spine road to the south of the site. It is anticipated that this phase will be complete in the Spring of 2025.

#### **Road Sweeping**

Countryside's site team work to ensure that the spine road is kept clean from mud and dirt caused by construction vehicles and road sweeping operates weekly.

#### **Contractor Parking**

We understand that contractor parking has been a concern for residents in the past. Countryside's site team have been actively implementing a fining system for our sub-contractor parking if found to be parked on the spine road or residential road.

#### Litter

Countryside are litter picking Andrewes way and Chancellor street weekly. Following handover to the Land Trust, Plant style will also now be litter picking these areas.

### **Timeline**

- The first occupations on Countryside's second phase took place in October 2023 and will continue up until Spring 2025.
- The Show homes and marketing suite for Phase 2 remains at the north of Wolsey Park Road.
- In phase 2 there is a mixture of adopted and private roads. The roads to be adopted by Essex Highways will be adopted following completion of the phase.

# **Public Open Space**

The Public Open Space, located to the western boundary of phase two, will be provided in line with construction progress on-site. We will be installing footpath connection links from the open space to the development which will provide residents with ease of access to the wider community. Works to prepare the land ahead of the being landscaped are due to commence this summer. We will be able to provide further updates on anticipated completion dates in future correspondence.

# **Managing Agent**

- The Land Trust took on the maintenance of Wolsey Park in April 2023. They are currently responsible for the northern end of the estate which includes the verges, swales and play areas as well as the meadow areas to the West.
- All remaining areas of open space on Phase 1
  were handed over to the Land Trust on the 1<sup>st</sup>
  June 2024.
- The Land Trust's landscape contractor at Wolsey Park is Plant Style Limited. They are responsible for routine maintenance such as grass cutting, hedge trimming, weeding, litter picking, emptying of litter and dog waste.
- The first areas of landscaping installed on Phase 2 are currently being maintained by Countryside's landscape contractor, MBM, who will maintain these areas prior to handover to the Land Trust.

#### **New Landscape Corridor**

The landscape corridor to the eastern boundary of the wider development is anticipated to be completed throughout 2024 and 2025. Once this is completed it will provide a new social space for the community of Wolsey Park, a second children's play area, a young space for teenagers, kickabout area and a community orchard and allotment

#### Childrens Play Area

We are aware that during periods of high rainfall there is a flow of water from the children's play area onto Wolsey Park road. Investigative works have been carried out however further works are required to find the source. These works are due to commence Autumn 2024. We will provide further updates in future correspondence.

# X30 Bus Service

Since October 2023, the X30, operated by First Bus has been running a service through Wolsey Park.



# How will the development benefit the local community?

Countryside have made financial contributions of over £3 million towards local projects such as investing in local school, NHS services and local roads and infrastructure.

#### **Education Site**

You will have recently received an update regarding the proposals for the education site at Wolsey Park. Alongside Countryside's financial contributions to education, part of the site has also been reserved for education facility should Essex County Council require it.

Essex County Council are progressing with a new SEND School which will be provided alongside a new early year's facility. If there are any specific matters you would like them to consider we would recommend writing to Essex County Council.

Please note the close board fencing surrounding the school site has been removed for security reasons, to provide passive surveillance and deter antisocial behaviour. During the construction of the school site, there will be construction hoarding placed around the boundary of the site, and in the long term there will be standard school fencing for the security of the school children.
